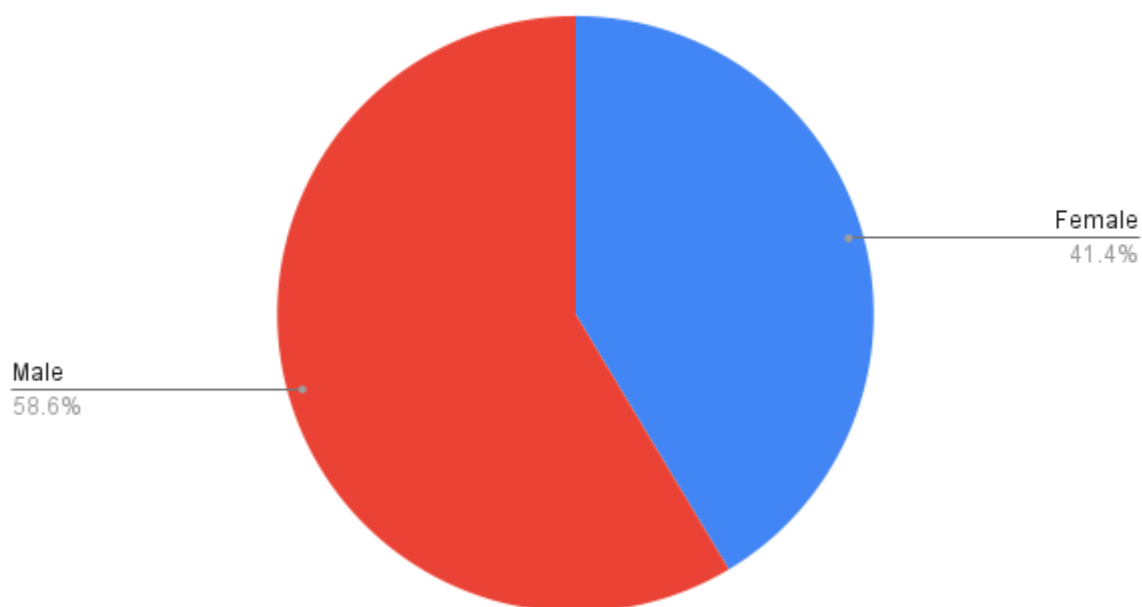

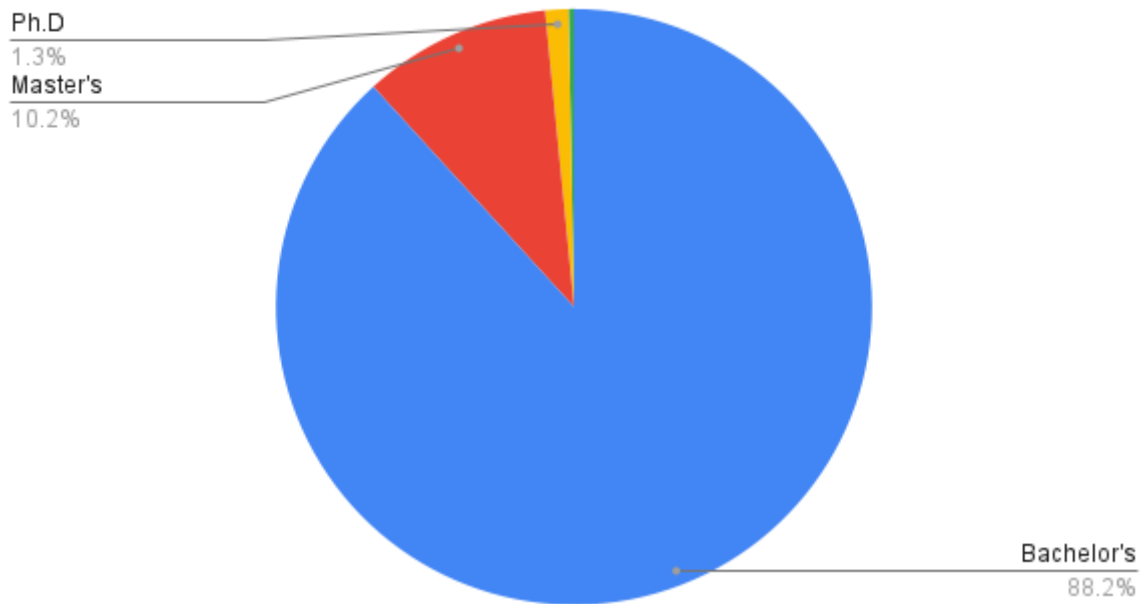

B) Gender

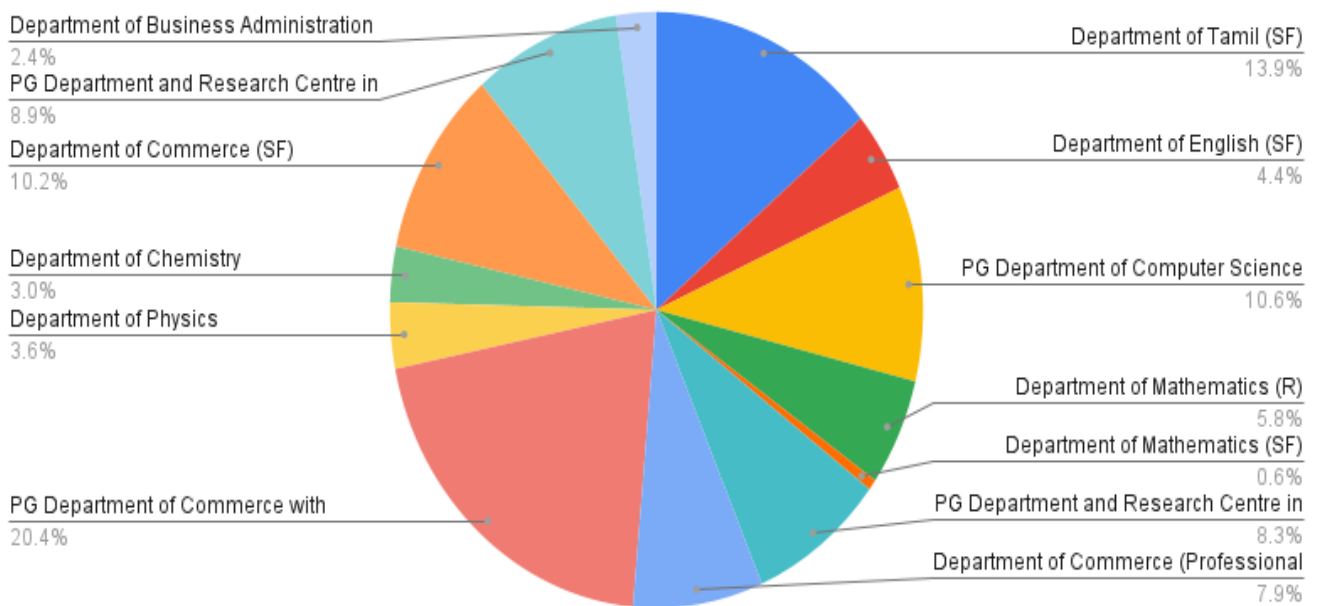


Among the 1029 student respondents 58.6% are males while 41.4% are females.

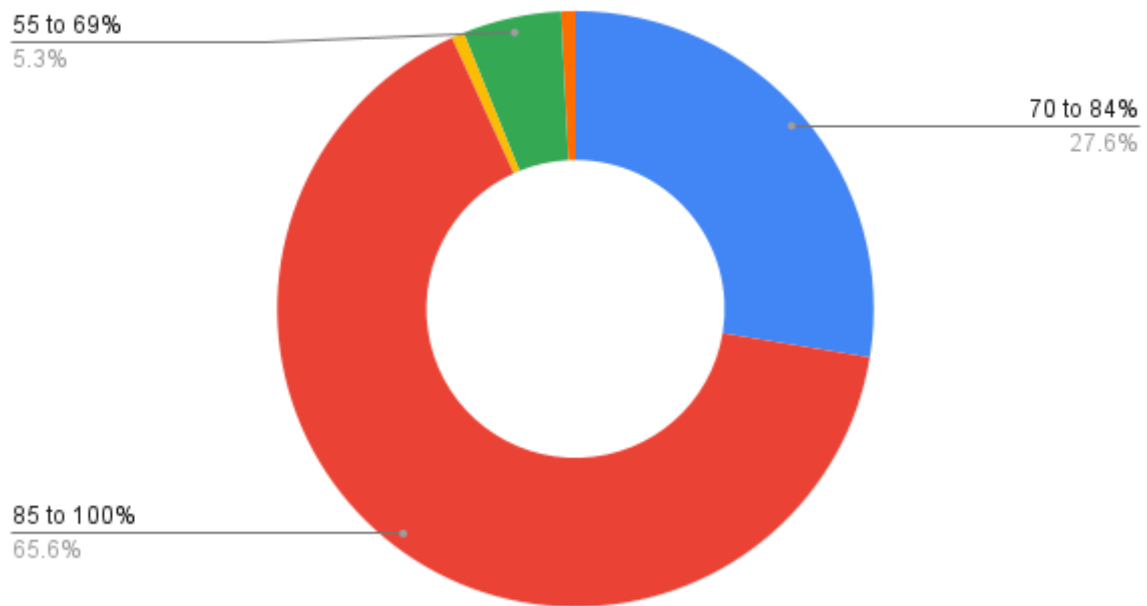
C) What degree program you are pursuing now?

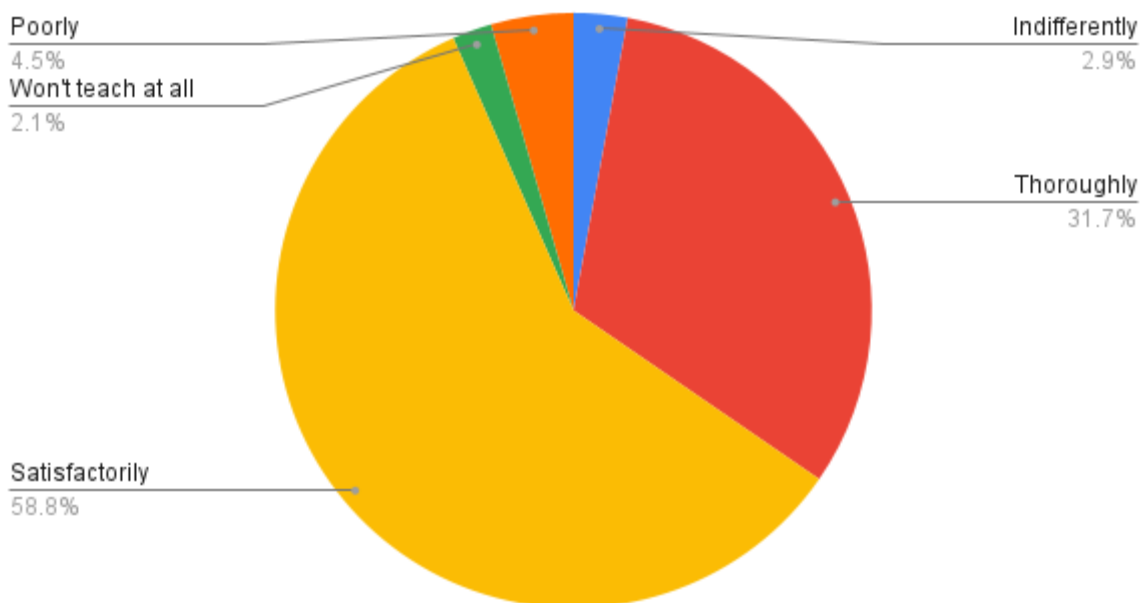


1. How much of the syllabus was covered in the class?



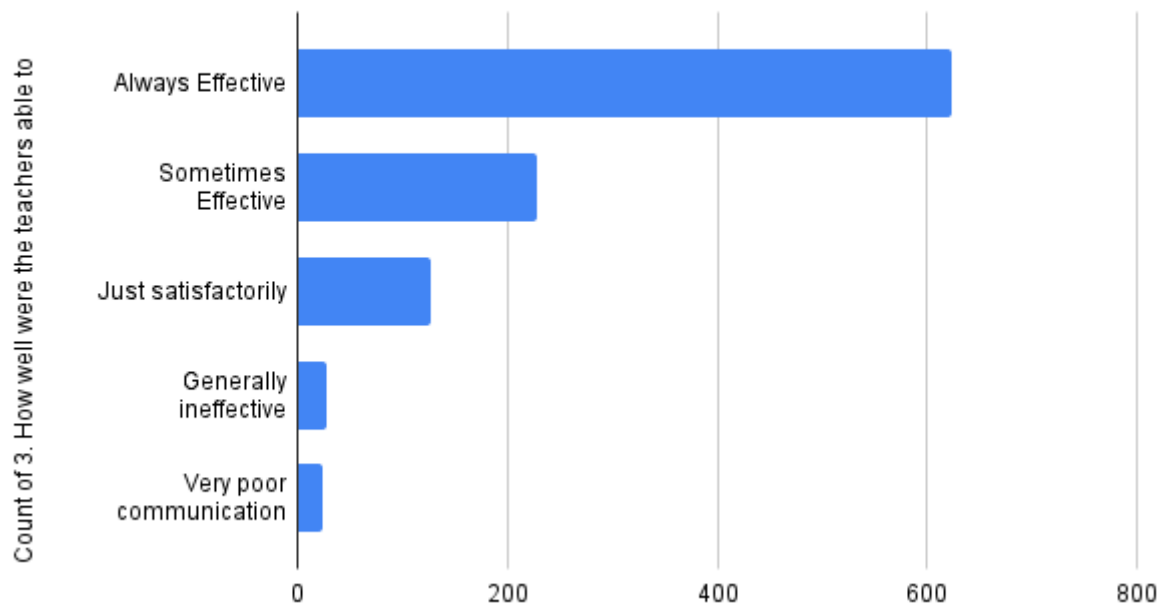
Out of 1029 students 284 (27.6%) said that 70-84% of the syllabus was covered in the class while 675 (65.6 %) students said that 85-100% of the syllabus was covered in the class.

2. How well did the teachers prepare for the classes?



Out of 1029 students 326 (31.7%) students confirmed that teachers prepared thoroughly for the class, 605 (58.8%) said teachers prepared satisfactorily while 13 (2.4 %) said they were indifferent.

3. How well were the teachers able to communicate?



Out of 1029 students 624 (60.6%) said that the teachers were always able to communicate effectively, 228 (22.2%) said that they were sometimes effective while 23(2%) said teachers were very poor in communication.

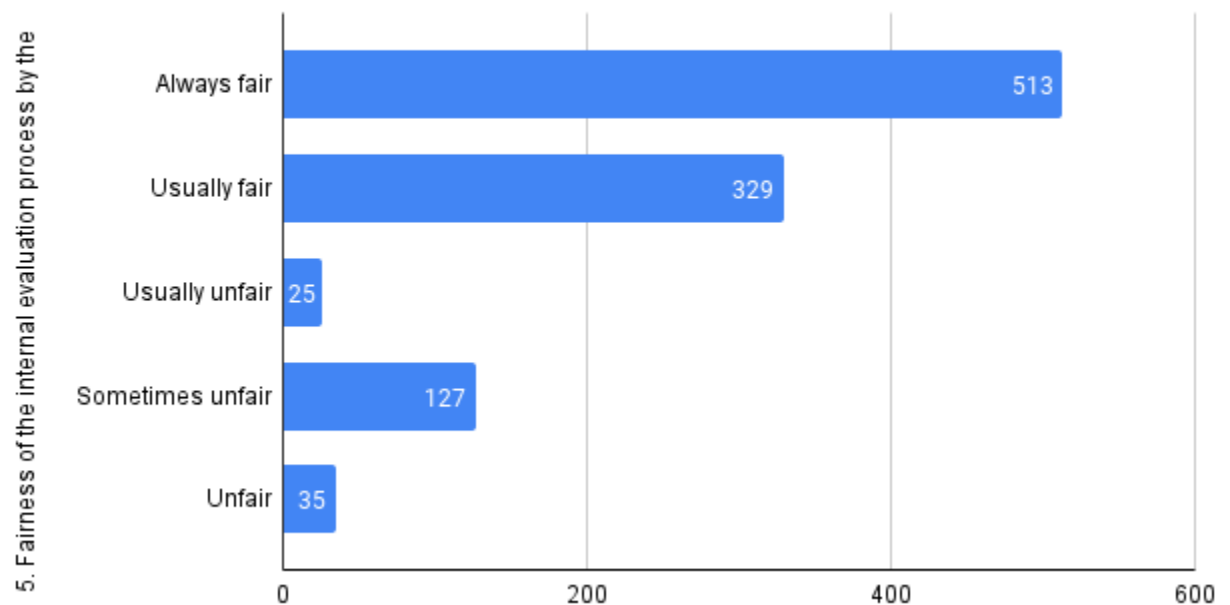
4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as



Count of 4. The teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as

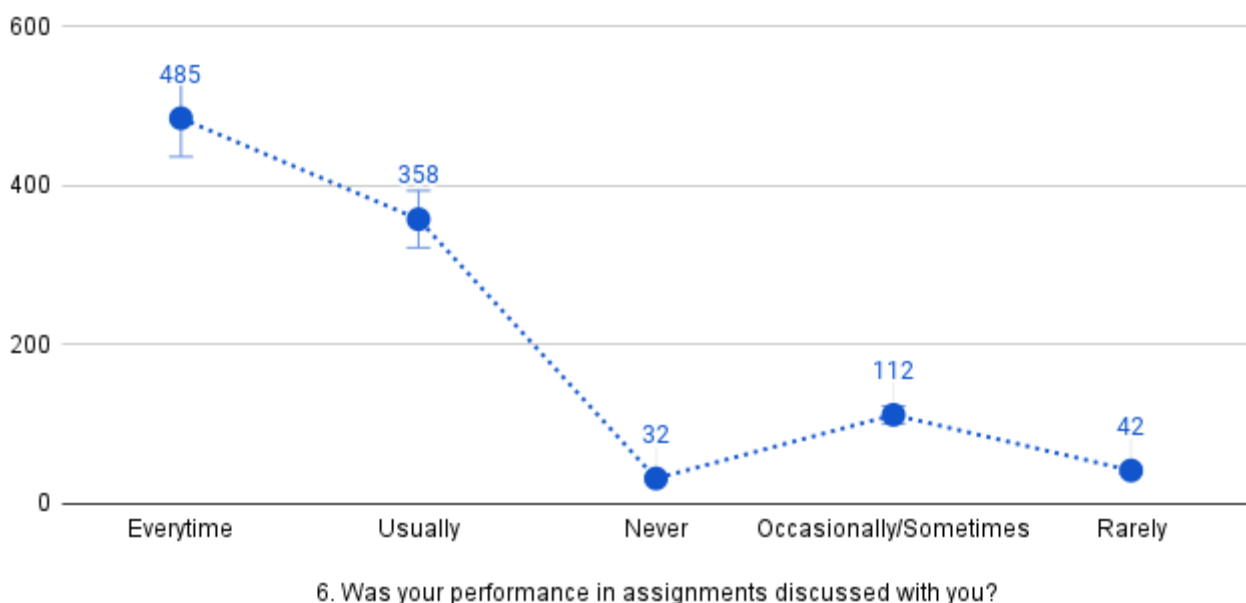
Out of 1029 students 357 (34.7%) said that the teacher's approach to teaching can best be described as excellent, 335 (30.9%) said it was very good, 296 (28.8%) said Good, 24(2.3%) said fair while 17 (1.7 %) said it was poor.

5. Fairness of the internal evaluation process by the teachers.



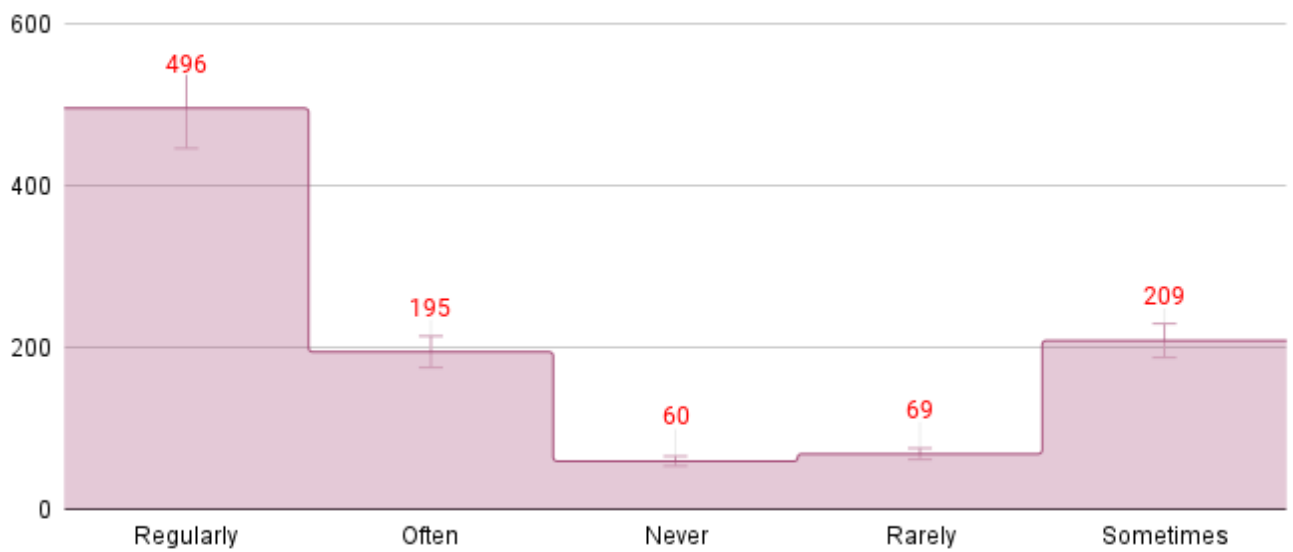
In all 513 students (49.9%) confirmed that the internal evaluation by the teachers was always Fair while 329(32%) said that they were usually Fair.

Of the 1029 students 485(47.1%) students confirmed that their performance in assignments were every time discussed with them, 358(34.8%) said usually and 32(3.1%) said never.

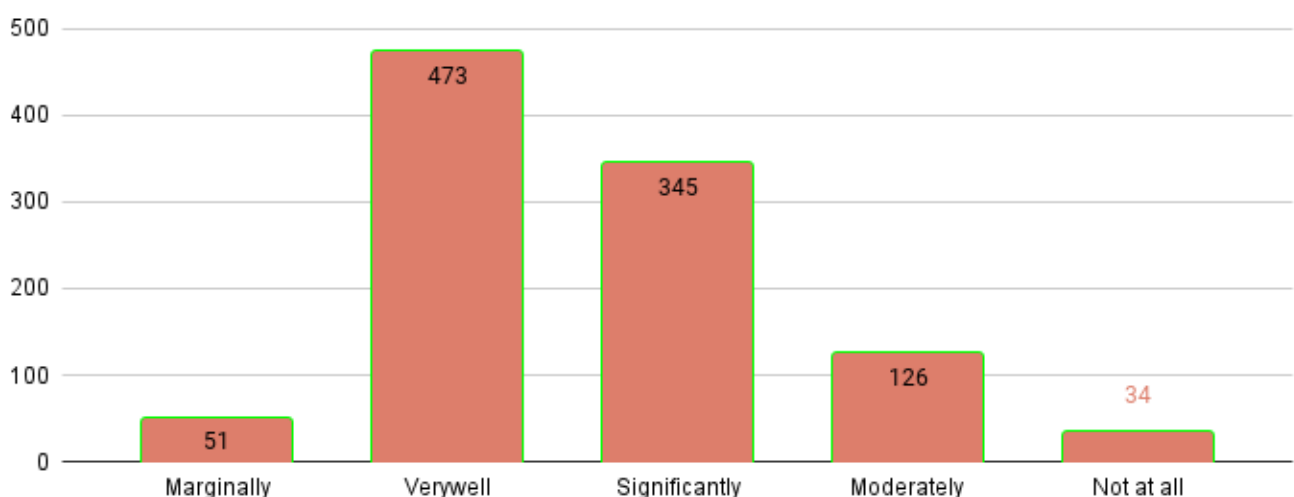
7. The institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities for students.



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Among the 1029 student respondents 496 (48.2%) said that the institute takes active interest in promoting internship, student exchange, field visit opportunities regularly, 195 (19%) said often while 209 (20.3%) said sometimes.

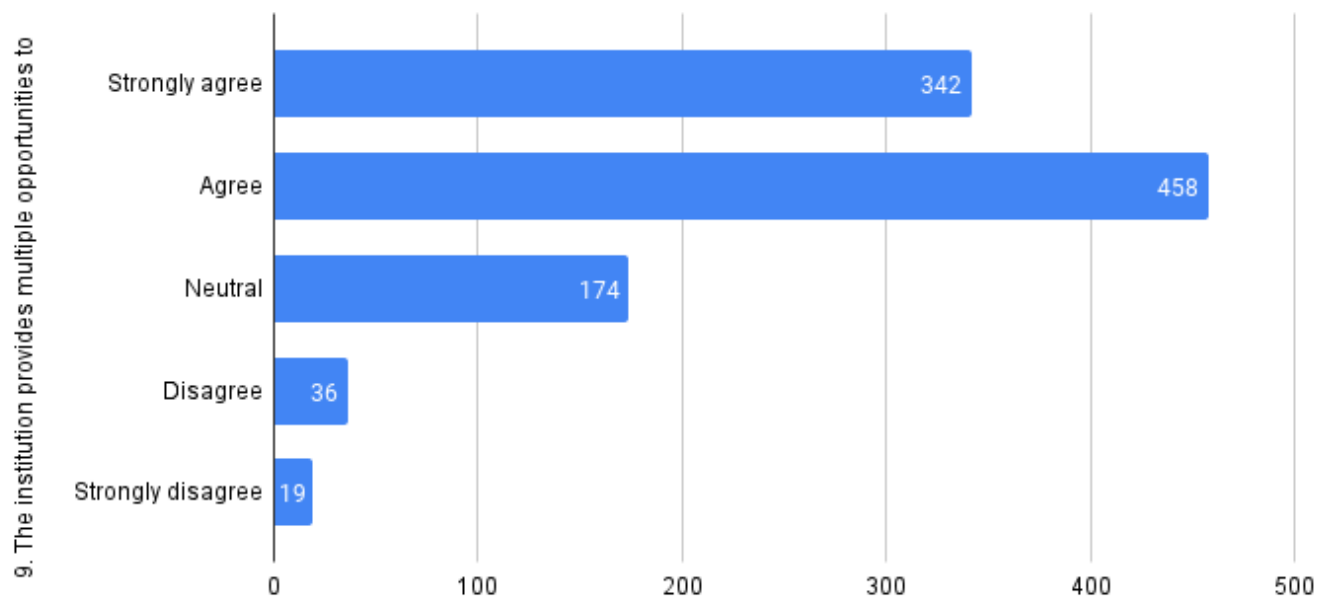
8. The teaching and mentoring process in your institution facilitates you in cognitive, social and emotional growth.



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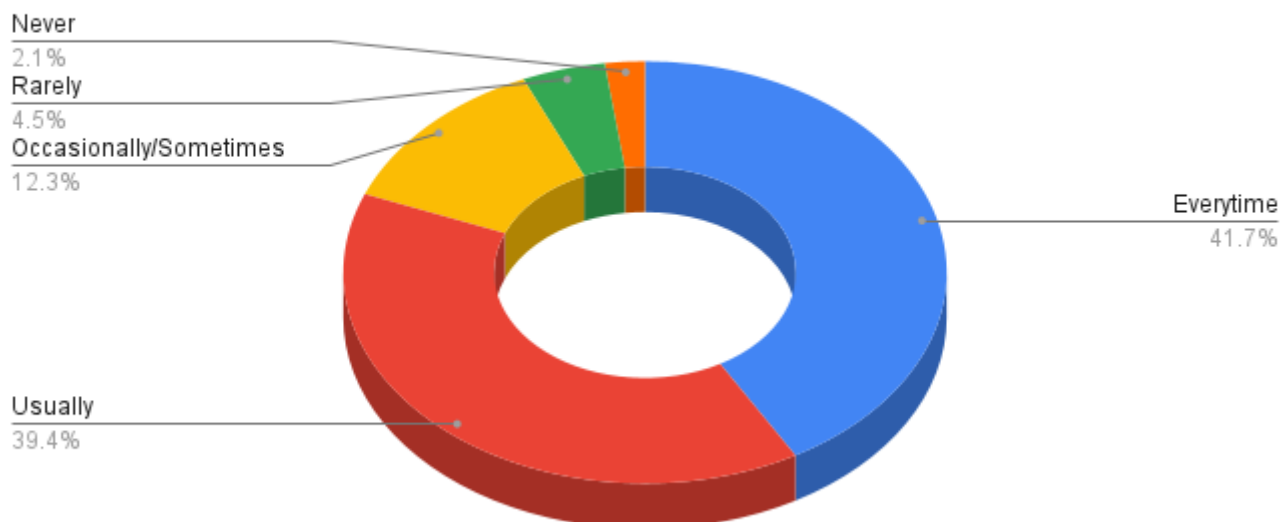
When asked whether the teaching and mentoring process in the institution facilitates in cognitive, social and emotional growth, 473 (46%) respondents said very well, 195 (48.1%) said significantly, 345 (33.5%) said moderately, 126 (5%) marginally and 34 (3.3%) not at all.

9. The institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow



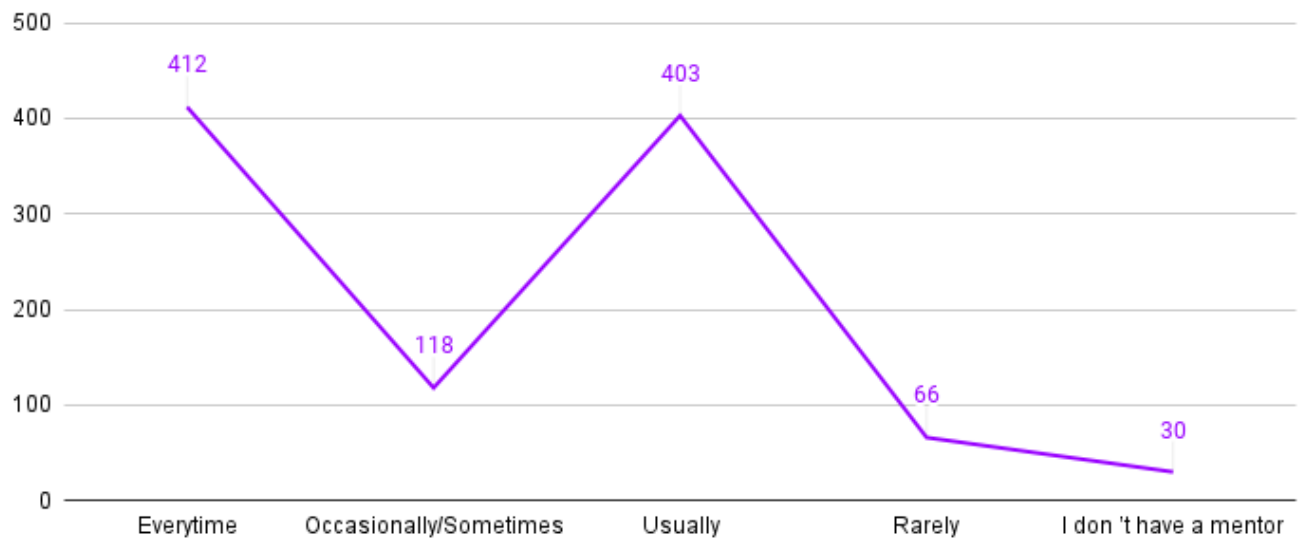
Of the 1029 students 254(33.2%) agreed that the institution provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow, 342(44.5%) strongly agreed, 174(16.9%) were neutral, 36 (3%) disagreed while 19 (3.5%) strongly disagreed.

10. Teachers inform you about your expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes



When asked whether the teachers informed about expected competencies, course outcome and programme outcomes 429 respondents (41.7%) said every time, 201 respondents (39.4%) said usually and 43 (12.3%) said occasionally/sometimes.

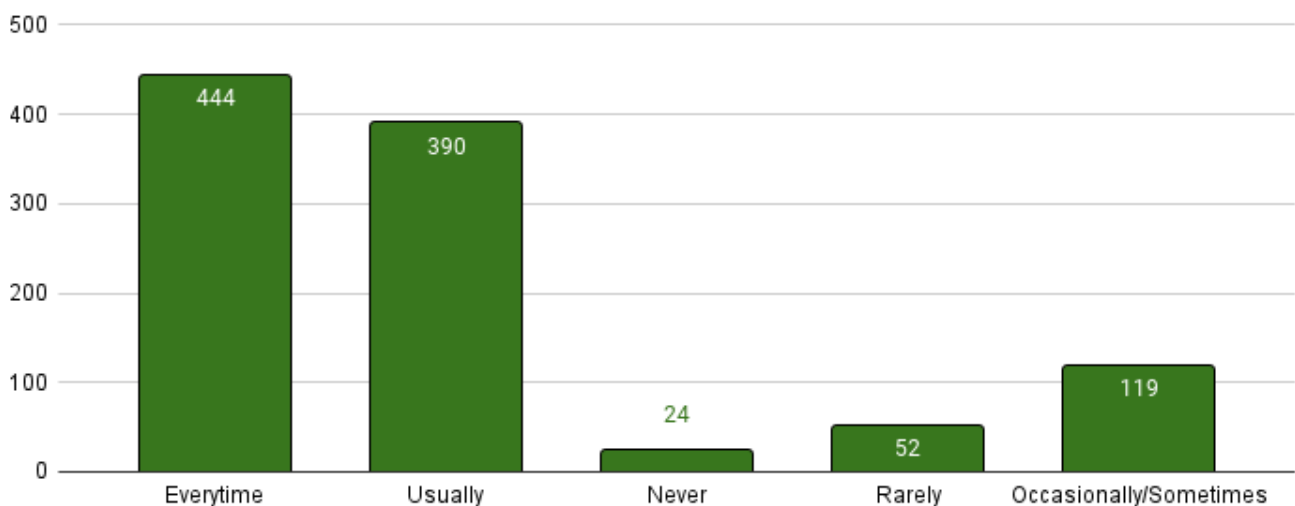
11. Your mentor does a necessary follow-up with an assigned task to you.



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Out of the 1029 students 412 (40%) students said that their mentor every time follows up the assigned task, 403(39.2%) said usually and 118(11.5%) said occasionally.

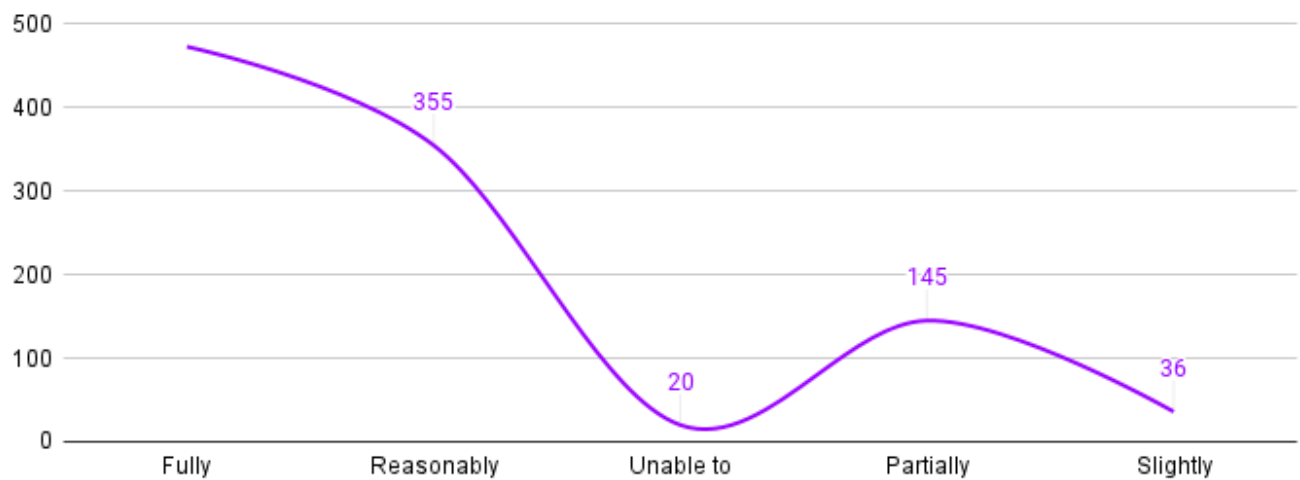
12. The teachers illustrate the concepts through examples and applications.



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A majority of 444 (43.1%) students said that their teacher illustrates the concepts through examples and applications while 390 (37.9%) said usually.

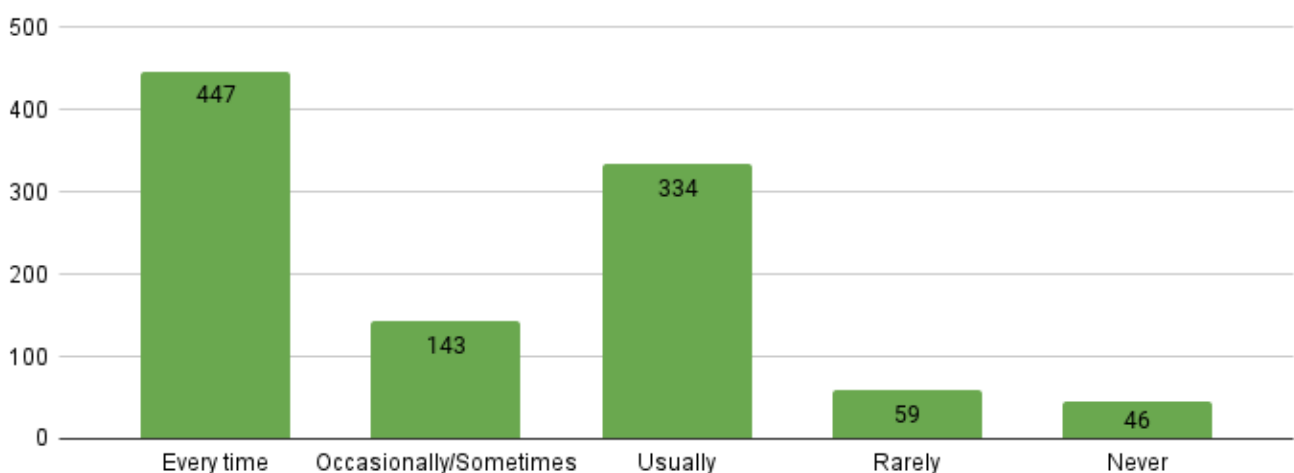
13. The teachers identify your strengths and encourage you with providing right level of challenges.



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Of the 1029 respondents, a majority of 473 (46.0%) students said that their teachers identify their strengths and encourage them with providing right level of challenges fully and 355 (34.5%) said reasonably.

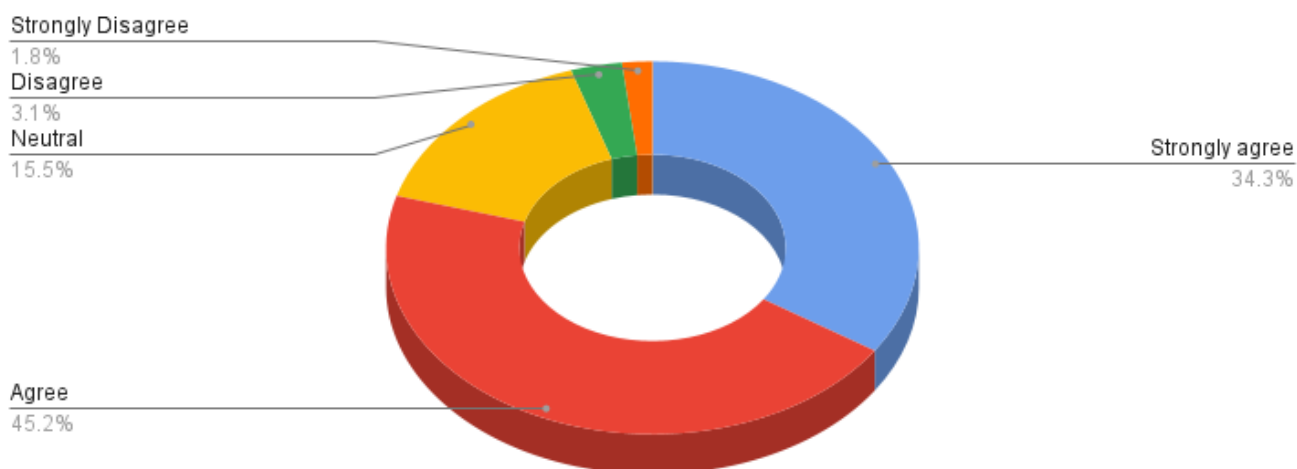
14. Teachers are able to identify your weaknesses and help you to overcome them.



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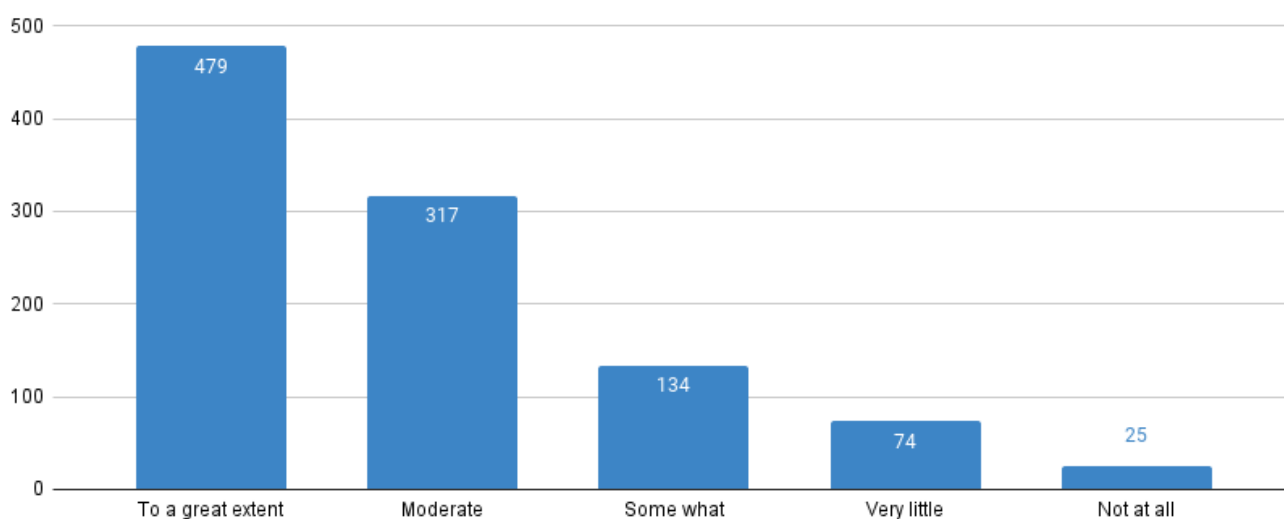
Of the 1029 student respondents, 447(43.4%) students said that teachers were able to identify their weakness and help to overcome them every time and 334 (32.5%) said usually

Of the 1029 student respondents a majority of 465(45.2%) agreed that the institution makes effort to engage students in the monitoring, review and continuous quality, 353(34.3%) strongly agreed while 19(1.8%) strongly disagreed.

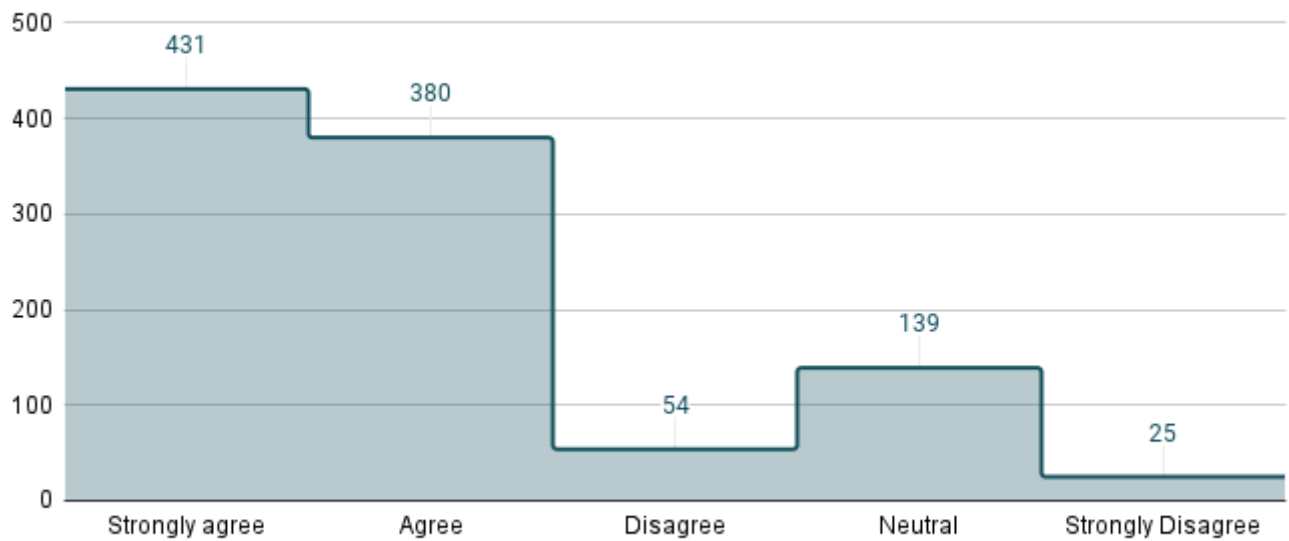
16. The institute/ teachers use student centric methods, such as experiential learning, participative learning and problem solving methodologies for enhancing learning



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Among the 1029 respondents a majority of 479 (46.6%) students confirmed that the institute / teachers use student centric methods such as experiential learning, participative learning to a great extent and 317 (30.8%) said they moderately used.

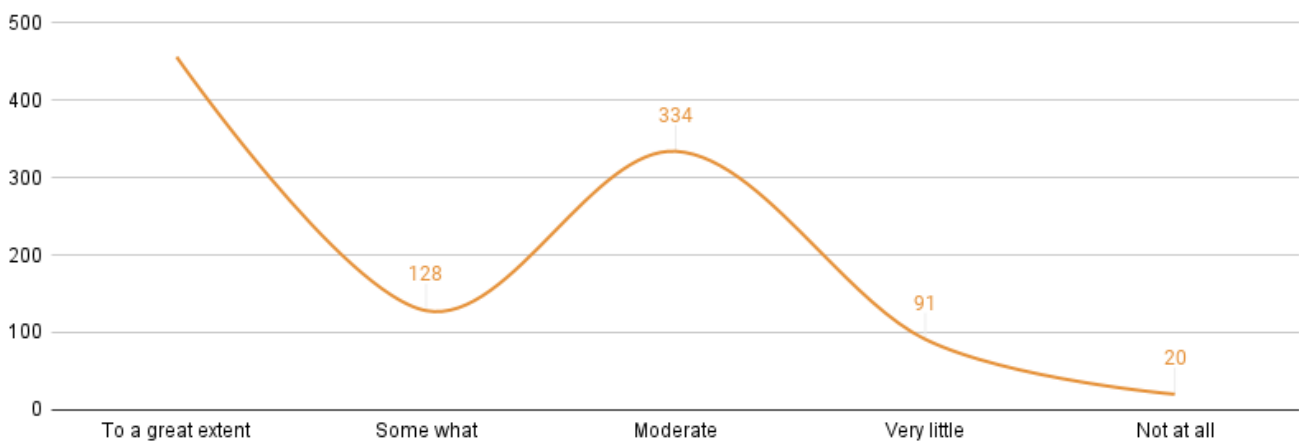
17. Teachers encourage you to participate in extracurricular activities.



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When asked if the teachers encourage them to participate in extracurricular activities a majority of 431 (41.9%) students strongly agreed and 380 (36.9%) students agreed.

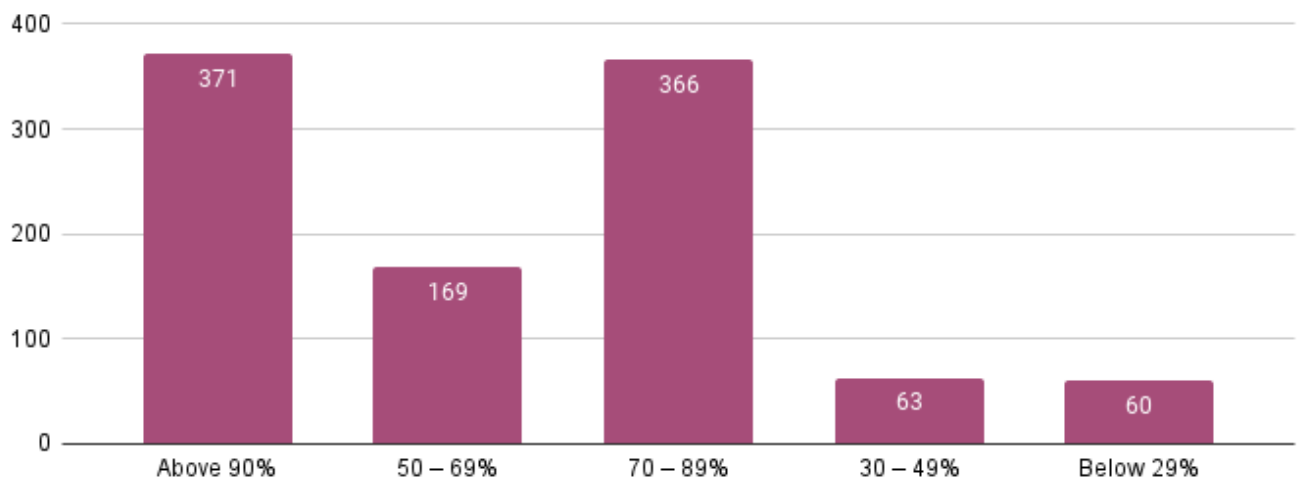
18. Efforts are made by the institute/ teachers to inculcate soft skills, life skills and employability skills to make you ready for the world of work.

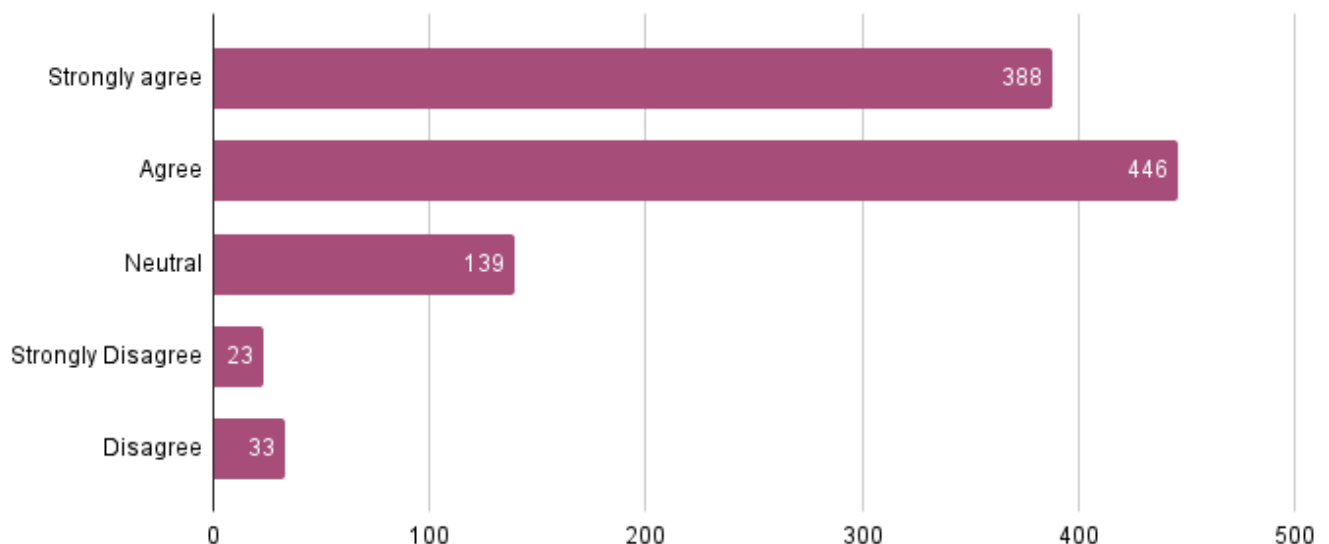
19. What percentage of teachers use ICT tools such as LCD projector, Multimedia, etc. while teaching.



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Of the 1029 student respondents 371 (36.1%) students 366 (35.6%) confirmed that 70-89%, 169(16.4%) said 50-69%.

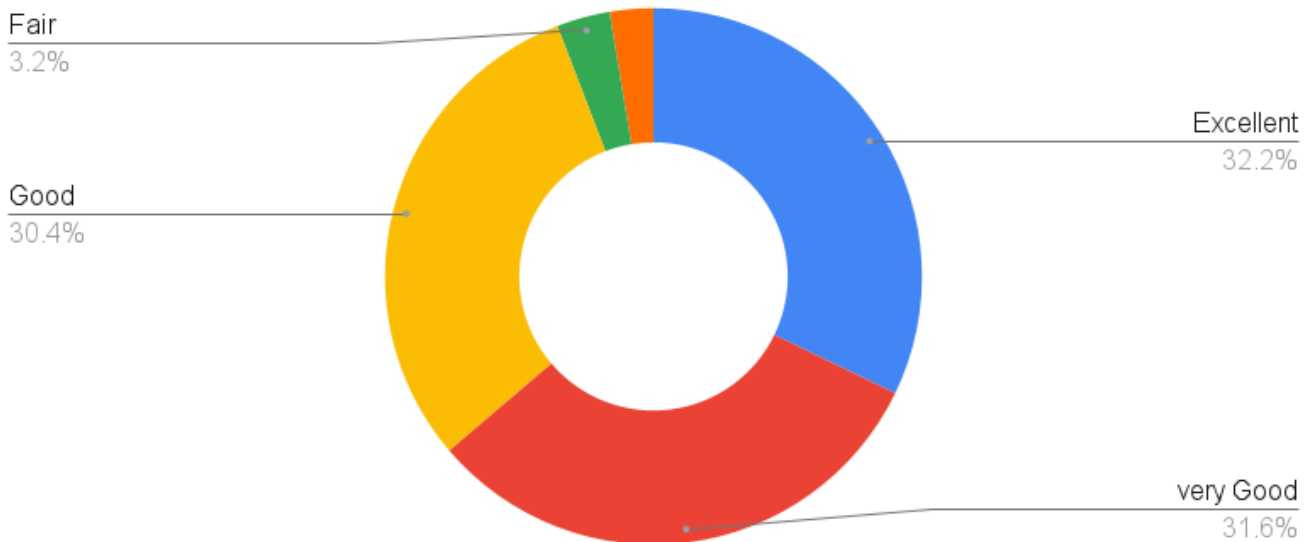
21. Quality of the programmes offered in the College?



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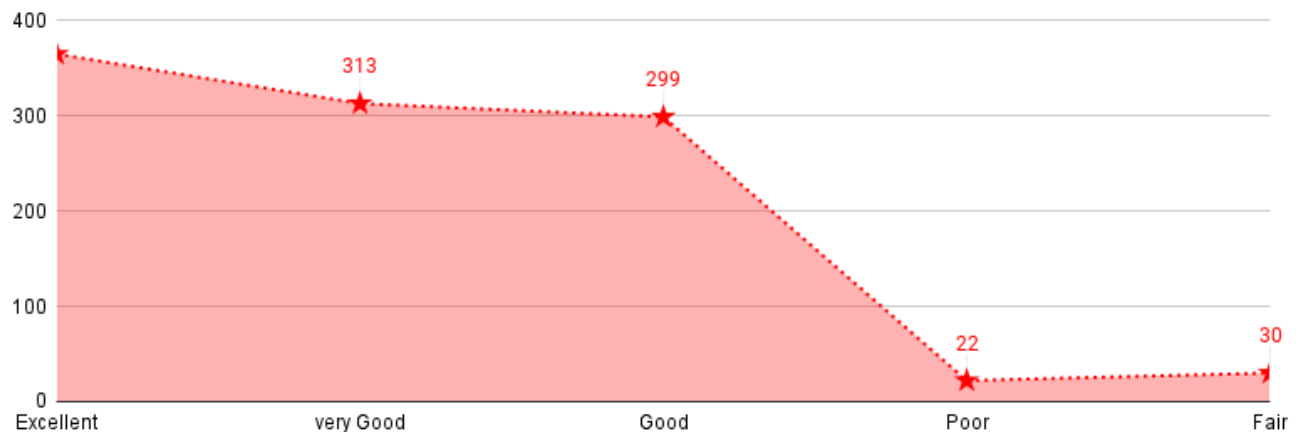

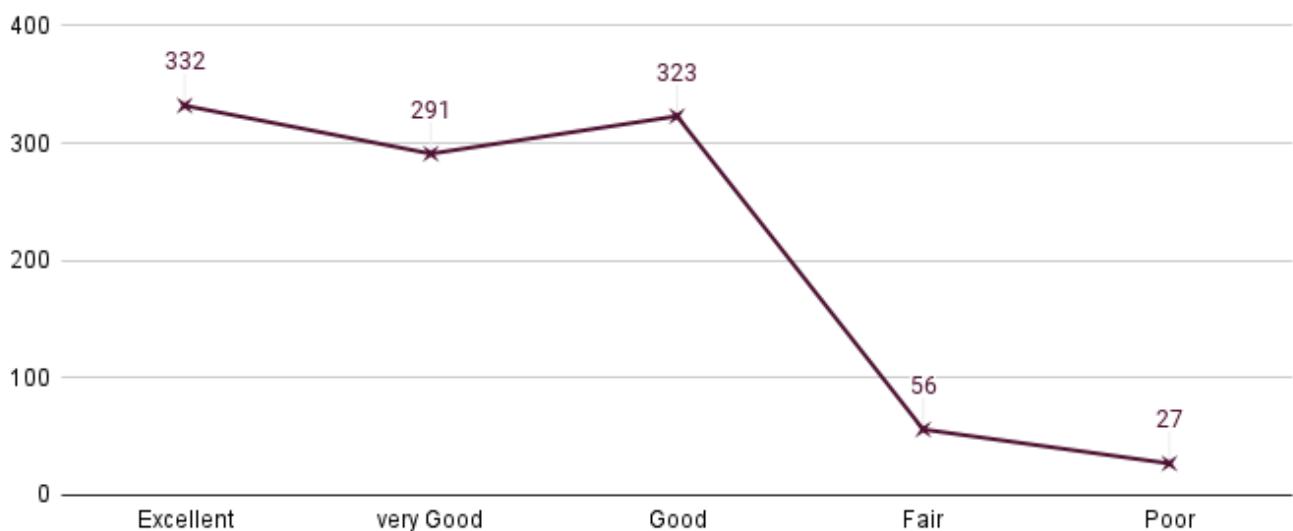
23. Library and laboratory facilities available in the campus promotes your academic pursuit

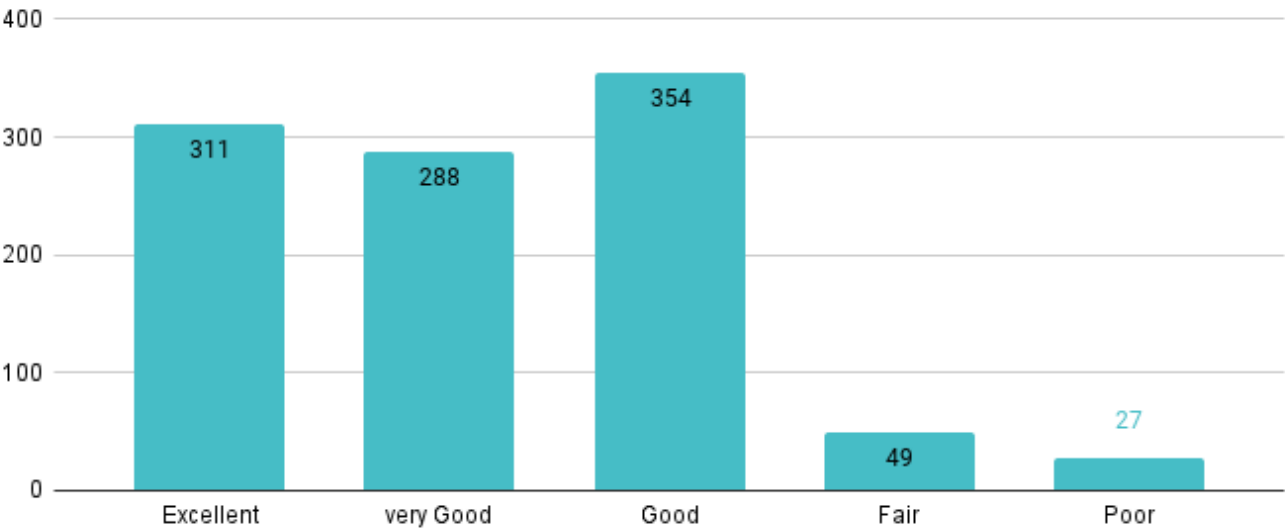
24. Institution ensures fool proof safety measures for the students
